## From the Pulpit Rev. Doug Neel

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Help Wanted! This is a welcome sign for many people during this time of economic hardship. To the person who is unemployed, it means that someone might just want your help and skills. And we have a number of people who are unemployed in this county. Even though the official count is twelve percent; some estimates are as high as sixteen percent or more. So when a business or restaurant posts a help wanted sign, it is also a sign of hope.

Help Wanted! If "faith" is the foundation of a parish family, then "ministry" is the cornerstone. We are all called to ministry by virtue of our baptism and our relationship with God. For each one of us that ministry can be quite different. St. Paul spoke of ministries such as teaching, preaching, prophesy and administration but our various ministries are much more diverse. Your ministry could be your approach to your job or feeding and clothing those in need. Your ministry might be visiting those who are sick or

confined to their home. It could be making prayer quilts or just praying for those who need our prayers. I know those who minister by writing notes to our visitors, folding and stuffing bulletins, teaching our children, and cleaning and ironing the linens for the



altar. I truly believe that one of the true challenges of our faith journey is discerning and pursuing our ministries.

But as you read over these "help wanted" ads don't forget that the ministry of the gospel is not confined to the four walls of our church building. God presents with opportunities for ministry every day.

Help Wanted! Hospice ministry coordinator: Because of her work load, Suzie Reno can no longer supervise our hospice ministry. Please talk to Suzie or me if you have a passion for this life-changing ministry.

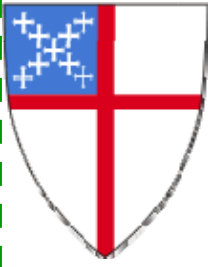

Stewardship is not a program.

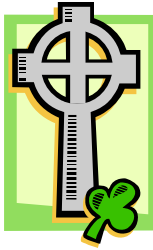
Stewardship is not raising money.

# Odds and Ends Jim Vierbicher, Sr. Warden



The Vestry is again at full strength; Barbara Ward has agreed to serve out Teri Sullivan's term for the remainder of this year.

Her appointment was unanimously approved by the Vestry. Barbara will be eligible to stand for reelection to the remaining two years of Teri's term at the annual meeting in January. Previously, Hank Williams had been appointed to replace Dick Boblit as Treasurer.

If you have been to the Church recently, you undoubtedly noticed that the drives and parking lot have been seal coated. Our Pagosa Blvd. facilities now eight years old. It is inevitable and necessary that some major maintenance items be done. Last year we stained the exterior of both the Church and Parish Hall. We also sealed the cracks in the pavement last fall before the onset of winter. This spring we are continuing these efforts with the seal coating of the pavements and completing staining of the bell tower. We are deferring replacement of the "fogged" windows in the nave

for now; this winter was hard on our roofs. There was considerable ice damage, so those repairs are also being made. These projects are funded by insurance payments and the building maintenance and reserve funds.

Lynne McCrudden has graciously consented to coordinate landscaping activities. If you are interested in helping please give Lynne a call.

There will be some changes made to our office operations. Dinah has asked that she be allowed to reduce her hours somewhat. The exact reduction, division of responsibilities and tasks has not been established at this time. The Vestry has consented to moving forward to both accommodate Dinah and to make other organizational changes, including hiring a part-time assistant to offset the reduction in Dinah's hours. Expect to see changes towards the end of July.

As noted in my earlier messages, with members leaving, having health issues, or otherwise being unable to put in as much time at the church as previously, we have experienced a drop in available manpower. We continue to

need many volunteers, in the office, on church facilities and certainly with our various committees. If you have the time and/or the interest, St. Patrick's can use you. Call Fr. Doug or myself or talk to any one of the Vestry members to volunteer your efforts.

Please note that we will be conducting two services, 8:00am and 10:00am during the months of July, August and perhaps September. The program will be evaluated at the end of this trial period. Tell your friends and see the articles and advertisements in the *Pagosa Sun*.

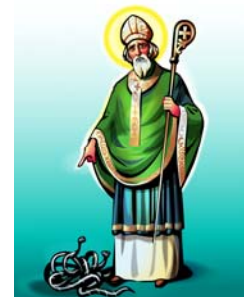
