## From the Pulpit Rev. Doug Neel

Dear Fellow Pilgrims of the Way:

"The bishop is coming! The bishop is coming!" Or by the time you read this, it might be more accurate to say, "The bishop was here." We are lucky to have Rob O'Neill as our bishop. I know that he has a great love and concern for our congregation and for its mission and ministry. The bishop is only able to visit once every several years in a diocese this size, so his presence is always cause for a great celebration.

His visitation has several purposes: one is simply to check on the health and ministry of the parish. Are we growing? Do we regularly attend Sunday worship? What ministry are we doing for the community and for each other? In addition, the bishop will confirm, receive and baptize members of our parish. In the Episcopal Church, administering the sacrament of confirmation is a ministry reserved for the bishop. In many ways, confirmation is the completion of the rite of initiation that begins with baptism. In the ancient church, new Christians who

were baptized were immediately anointed by the local bishop. The bishop then prayed that the newly baptized would receive the presence of the Holy Spirit. It eventually became impossible for the bishop to be present at all baptisms as the church



grew and Christianity spread. The anointing and laying on of hands was then postponed until the bishop was present. This became the Rite of Confirmation. Confirmation is especially helpful because it allows Christians that were baptized as young children to make a mature, public affirmation of their faith. On Sunday, we will pray that those being confirmed will be empowered by the Spirit for service and ministry.

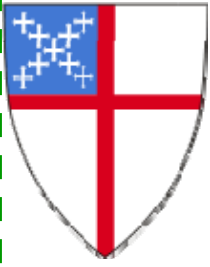
Confirmation also reminds

us that the church is quite a bit larger than our own parish family. The bishop represents not only the Episcopal Church beyond our parish, but also the universal church through all ages. He is "the apostle among us." When we are confirmed, one of the things we are saying is that we want to be part of that church. One of the ways we do it is by being in communion with our bishop.

### Easter Thank You

I know we will thank a lot of people for their ministry in another section of this newsletter, but I wanted to especially thank all who worked very hard to make our Holy Week and Easter services beautiful. Our Holy Week really began with the Passover Feast hosted by our Daughters of the King. The meal was inspirational, informative and delicious. But then the week accelerated from there. ## Spotlight on ..... Jeff Schaupp

**Please share a bit about your background.** I was born Jeffrey Todd Schaupp on September 11, 1961, in Norfolk, VA to Dr. and Mrs. Ronald Schaupp. My father was a ship's doctor on destroyers in the 282<sup>nd</sup>. Mom was an art teacher, but I was more than a full time job! Dad started residency as a radiologist in Cherry Hill, NJ until 1974. We moved to Watertown, NY where they resided until about 2000. My parents moved to Hamilton, NY (home of Dad's alma mater, Colgate University – Mom went to Wagner) and they still reside there. They are both originally from Floral Park, Long Island, NY. Grandpa Schaupp had a plumbing business for 45 years on Jamaica Ave. Sister Jennifer worked at Tiffany's after college in sales and lives in Sag Harbor, Long Island with her husband and three children. Mom and Dad are members of St. Thomas Episcopal in Hamilton, N.Y. established 1835 and Dad is an L.E.M.

**How did you come to Pagosa?** I came to Colorado in 1982 to work in the ski industry. Keystone, Copper Mountain, Breckenridge, Vail and Club Med were some of the places I found employment. Mostly I worked in banquet departments and food service establishments. In 1986, I moved to Grand Junction and worked on the Grand Mesa at Powderhorn Resort. A number of friends moved to Pagosa Springs in the winter of 1989. By spring I had visited and moved here and thought I had found Nirvana in Southern Colorado. It was hopping here in 1990 with all kinds of work in all fields. I worked at the Fairfield Lodge in the kitchen and was one of Bramwells Cabin dinner cooks in 1991. In the fall of 1991, I started painting with Ken Peterson (Custom Paint) and I still do some projects with Ken. Since 1993, I have painted on my own and still do. After 20 years, I can definitely call Pagosa home!



**What is your favorite book and why?** “*A Day In The Life Of Ivan Denisovich*” This book depicts two days of Ivan’s life in a Siberian prison from waking to laboring to sleeping and the hardships he and others endured. It really makes one appreciate our freedom! I Re-read it every couple of years to refresh thoughts on how lucky I’ve been in life.

**What is your favorite movie and why?** Jeremiah Johnson starring Robert Redford. At age 11 my mom took me to this incredible movie about a mountain man that chose to leave society and survive a harsh lifestyle in the Rocky Mountains in the late 1800’s. A little more than I wanted, however, the film gave me the long term desire to live around scenery as this movie captured.

**What types of things do you enjoy doing with your free time?** Bird watching, exploring ancient Indian culture, playing piano, music in general, and all outdoor activities.

**Are there ministries that you particularly enjoy being involved with at St. Pat's?** Helping with the painting and staining projects!

**Looking to the future, what changes would you like to see in St. Patrick's?** More members! And cheeses of Nazareth

**Are there other organizations or activities outside of church that are important to you?**

Land Alliance, water issues, Music Boosters, men’s prayer group Tuesday mornings at the Assembly of God (comfortable group).

**Can you give us an example of a time that St. Patrick's played an important role in your life?** I have always felt very much at home in the St. Patrick’s family.

**What's something you think members would enjoy knowing about you?** I am a bird guide for private individuals and Forest Service walks; I’m adopted; I attended Ohio Northern University with majors in philosophy & religion, art and psychology; I taught Special Olympics skiing.

## Living the Spiritual Life

Do you have questions about your spiritual life? Are you searching for ways of “Going Deeper” in your spiritual journey?

A 10-week study will explore the spiritual life as a journey of faith and transformation - a life that is deepened by accountability, community and relationships. Beginning June 5<sup>th</sup> at 10 a.m., we will utilize the timeless wisdom of renowned author Henry Nouwen to enhance our faith commitment to the spiritual disciplines required to live a spiritual life. Weekly discussions are structured around Nouwen’s ten universal questions for living the spiritual life. The study text “*Spiritual Direction - Wisdom for the long Walk of Faith*” is wrapped in parables, personal narratives and biblical reflections. Nouwen’s text guides the reader on a faith-deepening journey. Nouwen’s “Reflect and Journal” techniques are essential preparation for the weekly class conversations.



Please invite your friends. The discussions are open to the community and designed to include anyone from any walk of faith, religious affiliation or non-affiliation; from those who consider themselves deeply spiritual to those who are simply curious or spiritually provoked.

Our own Loretta Barker, a trained spiritual director, will lead our journey. “Our time together will be to listen to that voice that speaks in our silence so that we may discover where God is active in our life right now and where we are being led.” In Nouwen's own words, “Being formed in God's likeness involves the struggle to move from absurd living (distractions and disruptions), to obedient listening.”

It is recommended that participants read the book prior to the first meeting. Then, re-read one chapter each week – slowly and meditatively – as preparation for the weekly discussions. Nouwen’s book is available from numerous websites and local bookstores. Bring your book and journal to each meeting.

There is no participation fee, however, please register for the class prior to June 1<sup>st</sup> by completing the registration form found on the church website, [www.stpatrickspagosa.org](http://www.stpatrickspagosa.org). ## Shamrock Festival by Lynn McCrudden, festival co-chair



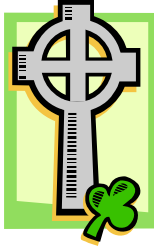

# Did you know? Jim Vierbicher, Sr. Warden



My goodness! As I write this article, and as you read it, almost a third of the year will be over. Unbelievable! Where does the time go?

It seems like only a little while ago we were celebrating Christmas and then just a few days ago, the Easter Season. Busy times! Especially the Easter Season: the Seder dinner, Maunday Thursday, the watch, Good Friday, the Easter vigil, and of course Resurrection Sunday. I hope you were able to participate in at least some of those events, either here at St. Patrick's or wherever you may have been. May the spirit of Easter remain with for the rest of the year.

That's not the end though. Did you know that:

- April 23, 24 the ECW will have their annual Retreat; about 20 women will have participated.
- Sunday May 2 Bishop O'Neill will be at St. Patrick's. He will confirm six individuals and officiate a baptism.
- On that same day, the Prayer Quilt Ministry will celebrate its fifth anniversary. There will be a reception to celebrate the Bishop's visit, the quilt anniversary

and the birthday of a certain celebrated Rector.

- May 13 and 14 volunteers from the Men's Fellowship will travel to Navajo Land to do maintenance projects at St. Luke's Church.
- May 19 the men will have their spring Steak and Stein dinner. John Vick, fatherhood advocate for Archuleta County will speak on "The Face of Poverty."
- Sunday May 23 will be the final session of Sunday school until the fall. There will be a celebration with the children at the 10:00 am service.
- Saturday June 12 the Men's Fellowship will do a Habitat build day at House 20.
- Saturday June 19 is the annual SIDS Lobster dinner and ECW bake sale.
- Saturday August 21 is the annual Shamrock Festival
- Saturday September 11 will be our first Ministry Fair, a time to learn how we can share our time and talents and volunteer.
- October 23 is the annual Community Clothing Give Away.
- And don't forget Adult Education, Spiritus, Sunday Night Unplugged,

the potlucks and special summer fellowship events that occur regularly.

Individual contributions were up more than 35% in the 1st Qtr. Expenses were up considerably too (full responsibility for medical insurance, snowplowing, etc) but the deficit was down somewhat from a year ago. Our goal is to balance the Budget by December 31, 2011.

Our outreach efforts were substantial in the first quarter: 135 food boxes, in excess of \$2700 from Fr. Doug's discretionary fund and \$5,000 of the 2009 Shamrock Festival proceeds distributed to the community. The Men's Fellowship has begun a Helping Hands program for congregation members.

Thank you to all who have/will participate in these activities and or otherwise supported them. For the rest of you, please join in. The fellowship is great, the activities lots of fun and "many hands make light work."

## Stewardship Focus 2010 by Linda Altman



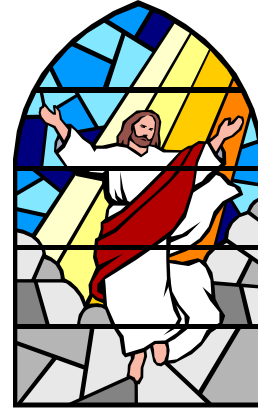
Attention Parents and Grandparents!

The Men's Fellowship met on Saturday, April 17 at 8:30 am. We reviewed the activities calendar and discussed upcoming events.



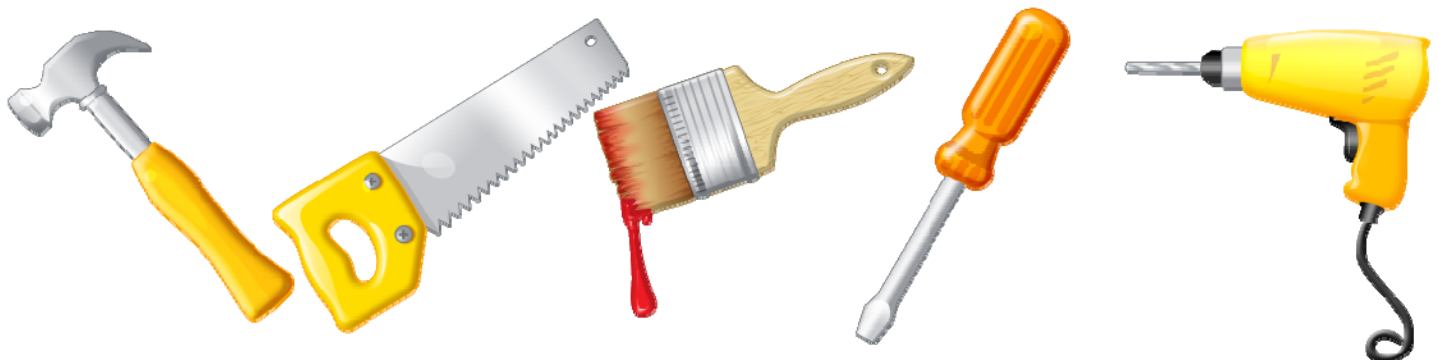
